FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

By Decision No. 62221, dated June 30, 1961, the Commission authorized Livingston Telephone Company, a corporation, to issue \$80,000 of 6% interim demand notes, and thereafter to issue its \$80,000 6% final note to replace the interim notes.

In its petition for modification filed on August 30, 1961, the company reports that through inadvertence the original application failed to request authority to execute a proposed new loan agreement or mortgage, copies of which are attached to said petition as Exhibits A and B, respectively. In the present petition the company now seeks the necessary authorization.

The Commission has considered this petition for modification and finds and concludes that a public hearing is not necessary, and that the petition should be granted, therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that -


1. Livingston Telephone Company, a corporation, may enter into a loan agreement with General Dynamics Corporation, and may execute and deliver a real property and chattel mortgage, which agreement and mortgage shall be in the same, or substantially the same, form as those attached to its petition for modification as Exhibit A and Exhibit B, respectively.

2. Livingston Telephone Company, a corporation, may execute and deliver any supplemental mortgages of real property and chattels required by the terms of said loan agreement.

3. The Order in Decision No. 62221, dated June 30, 1961, shall remain in full force and effect.


4. This First Supplemental Order shall become effective on the date hereof.
