### SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. 62599 , entered today, the Commission revised the rates and charges in City Carriers' Tariff No. 1-A, City Carriers' Tariff No. 2-A - Highway Carriers' Tariff No. 1-A and Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2. That decision also found that, in order to avoid duplication of tariff distribution, City Carriers' Tariff No. 2-A - Highway Carriers' Tariff No. 1-A should be amended by separate order.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. City Carriers' Tariff No. 2-A Nighway Carriers' Tariff No. 1-A (Appendix A of Decision No. 41362, as amended) is hereby further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective Movember 4, 1961, the revised pages attached hereto and listed in Appendix A also attached hereto, which revised pages and appendix are made a part hereof by this reference.
- 2. Tariff publications required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be filed not earlier than the effective date hereof, to become effective on not less than five

days' notice to the Commission and to the public, and such tariff publications shall be made effective not later than November 4, 1961.

- 3. Common carriers are hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of Article XII, Section 21, of the State Constitution, and of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code, to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the rates published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.
- 4. In all other respects the aforesaid Decision No. 41362, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.
