O R D E R

County of Contra Costa is authorized to construct Sycamore Valley Road at grade across a track of Southern Pacific Company near Danville, Contra Costa County, at the location and substantially as described in the application as amended August 21, 1961, to be identified as Crossing No. BO-55.5. Applicant shall bear entire construction expense, also maintenance cost outside of lines two feet outside of rails. Southern Pacific Company shall bear maintenance cost between such lines. Width of crossing shall be not less than thirty-eight feet and grades of approach not greater than six percent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 1 crossing signs (General Order No. 75-B) reflectorized with reflex-reflective sheet material.

Upon completion, Crossing No. BO-55.3 about two-tenths mile northerly shall be abolished by physical closing by Southern Pacific Company. Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization

may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require.

Applicant desires to begin construction as soon as possible and has requested immediate authorization. Therefore the effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
