OPINION AND ORDER

This application was filed April 5, 1961. The purpose of this application is to secure the authorization of the Commission for Stockton Elevators to transfer to Pacific International Rice Mills, Inc., operating rights of Stockton Elevators to conduct a warehouse operation of 29,750 square feet at Mendota, California.

It is alleged in the application (1) that both applicants are organized as subsidiaries of Pacific Vegetable Oil Corporation; (2) that the reason for requesting this transfer is that Pacific International Rice Mills, Inc., is primarily involved in matters concerning rice and the Mendota operation is heavily concentrated in the drying and handling of rice. The managements of both applicants feel that it would be more efficient and economical for Pacific International Rice Mills, Inc., to conduct the Mendota operation. Stockton Elevators has therefore consented and agreed to transfer and release all its rights to such warehouse operation in consideration of Pacific International Rice Mills, Inc., agreeing to assume all obligations of the operation and conduct the business at the same rates and on the same basis as before, and (3) that Pacific International Rice Mills, Inc., is experienced in public utility

warehouse service and will give equal or better warehouse services to the public as are being given now.

The Commission has considered this matter and finds and concludes (1) that the proposed transfer will not be adverse to the public interest and (2) that a public hearing is not necessary.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Within one hundred twenty days after the effective date hereof, Stockton Elevators may transfer, and Pacific International Rice Mills, Inc., may acquire the operative rights referred to in the application.

2. On not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public, effective concurrently with the consummation of such transfer, applicants shall supplement or reissue the tariffs now on file with the Commission, insofar as they name rates, rules and regulations governing the warehouse operation here involved to show that Stockton Elevators has withdrawn or canceled and that Pacific International Rice Mills, Inc., concurrently has adopted or established as its own, said rates, rules and regulations. The tariff filings made pursuant to this order in all respects shall comply with the regulation governing the construction and filing of warehouse tariffs set forth in the Commission's General Order No. 61.






amended by substituting First Revised Page 1 in revision of Original Page 1.

Pacific International Rice Mills, Inc., a corporation,
possesses a prescriptive operative right as a public
utility warehouseman for the operation of storage or
warehouse floor space as follows:

Woodland (Yolo County)	36,380
Richfield and Vicinity (Tehama County)	59,400
Mendota (Fresno County)	29,750
