ORDER DISCONTINUING INVESTIGATION

On August 17, 1961, General Telephone Company of California (General) filed with the Commission, under Advice Letter No. 1172, Revised Cal. P.U.C. Sheets Nos. 8823-T, 8824-T, 8825-T, 8826-T and 8827-T, reflecting expansion of its Crestline exchange area northerly to include certain unfiled territory. On August 25, 1961, California Interstate Telephone Company filed Application No. 43707 with the Commission requesting authority to establish a new exchange with a southern boundary coincident with the present northern boundary of General's Crestline exchange. Because of the conflict thus brought about, the Commission, on September 5, 1961, instituted its investigation under Case No. 7184 and suspended to and including January 15, 1962, the tariff filing made by General under Advice Letter No. 1172.

On October 12, 1961, General addressed a letter to the Commission withdrawing said tariff filing and requesting that Case No. 7184 be discontinued. Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that Case No. 7184 be, and it hereby is,
discontinued.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days
after the date hereof.
