
ORDER

County of Orange is authorized to construct Fourth Street at grade across Southern Pacific Company's Tustin Branch in Orange County, at the location described in the application, to be identified as Crossing No. BM-521.7. Applicant shall bear entire construction expense, also maintenance cost outside of lines two feet outside of rails. Southern Pacific Company shall bear maintenance cost between such lines. Width of crossing shall be not less than 24 feet and grades of approach not greater than two percent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 8 flashing light signals (General Order No. 75-B).

Upon completion of Crossing No. BM-521.7, the private crossing approximately 100 feet northeasterly of the proposed crossing shall be abolished through physical closing by the County of' Orange.

Within thirty days after completion, pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This

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authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
