

ORDER DENYING MODIFICATION AND STAY OF EFFECTIVE DATE


Reliable Delivery Service, Inc., a corporation, as successor in interest to respondent, Babe Talsky, doing business as Reliable Delivery Service, filed a petition for rehearing or reconsideration on the record of Decision No. 59118, dated October 6, 1959, in Case No. 6122. The Commission, by Decision No. 59575, dated February 1, 1960, denied the petition for rehearing or reconsideration. On June 28, 1961, the California State Supreme Court affirmed the Commission's decision (56 A.C., page 141, June 28, 1961). Thereafter, by Decision No. 62385, dated August 8, 1961, the Commission modified the order of Decision No. 59118 by reducing the period of suspension from twenty days to five days. On August 31, 1961, the respondent filed a petition for modification and stay of effective date requesting that the period of suspension imposed by Decision No. 62385 be stricken and that the Commission substitute for said suspension a fine of \$5,000. The Commission having considered the latter petition and each of the allegations therein, and being of the opinion that no good cause has been shown for the granting thereof,


IT IS ORDERED that the petition for modification and stay
