ORDER

Southern Pacific Company is authorized to construct an additional spur track at grade across and along Harrison Street near 18th Street in the City and County of San Francisco, at the location and substantially as described in the application, to be identified as a portion of Crossing No. E-2.25-C. Construction of said crossing shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72, without superelevation and of a width to conform to the portion of the street now graded, with tops of rails flush with the roadway and with grades of approach not exceeding one percent. Protection shall be by existing Standard No. 1 crossing signs, reflectorized by reflexreflective sheet material (G.O. No. 75-B). Applicant shall bear entire construction and maintenance expense.

Applicant is authorized to deviate from the requirement of Section 3.17 of General Order No. 26-D provided no obstructions are located between said track and the curb line of Harrison Street.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order. applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity,
