OPINION AND ORDER

Warren Ballinger, doing business as Warren Ballinger Warehouse Co., requests authority to suspend public warehouse operations for a period of one year.

Applicant has been operating a public warehouse service in the City of San Francisco since before 1927. It is alleged that on October 29, 1961, a fire started on premises adjacent to those of applicant; that the fire spread to applicant's warehouse located at 700 Indiana Street and caused such damage as to render a continuation of public warehouse service impossible; and that applicant has no knowledge as to when adequate facilities may be acquired. He therefore requests a suspension of one year.

After consideration, the Commission finds and concludes that the proposed suspension would not be adverse to the public interest and that a public hearing is not necessary.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Warren Ballinger may suspend public warehouse operations in the City of San Francisco for a period of one year from the effective date hereof.

2. After the effective date hereof applicant shall amend his tariffs presently on file with this Commission to reflect the authority herein granted.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
