SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By the decision hereinafter identified, V. R. Anderson was granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing operations as a highway common carrier of general commodities. The following commodity exclusion is included in the certificate:

"Commodities requiring the use of special refrigeration or temperature control in specially designed and constructed refrigerated equipment."

Under Decision No. 61177, dated December 13, 1960, in Case No. 5432, temperature control charges were established on

"Commodities requiring protection from heat by the use of ice (either water or solidified carbon dioxide) or by mechanical refrigeration."

By letter dated June 27, 1961, the carrier informed the Commission that he would have no objection to the revision of his certificate to make the commodity exclusion consistent with the application of the temperature control charges. The certificate will be amended accordingly. A public hearing is not necessary.


(1) The certificate of public convenience and necessity granted to V. R. Anderson by Decision No. 54648, dated March 12, 1957, in Application No. 35955, is hereby amended by substituting First Revised Page 1 in place and stead of Original Page 1.


(2) Within one hundred twenty days after the effective date hereof, and on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and the public, V. R. Anderson shall amend his tariffs on file with the Commission to reflect the authority granted herein.


The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.



V. R. Anderson, by the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted in the decision noted in the margin, is authorized to transport:

- (a) General Commodities between Los Angeles Territory, as described on Appendix B attached hereto, on the one hand, and San Diego Territory, as described on Appendix B attached hereto, on the other hand.
- (b) Sand between Oceanside, on the one hand, and all points and places in Los Angeles and Orange Counties and all points and places in San Diego County, other than Oceanside, all on the other hand.

The operating right described in paragraph (a) above does not include the right to service intermediate points.

Applicant shall not transport any shipments of:

1. Used household goods and personal effects not packed in accordance with the crated property requirements set forth in paragraph (d) of Item No. 10-C of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 4-A.
2. Automobiles, trucks and buses, viz.: new and used, finished or unfinished passenger automobiles (including jeeps), ambulances, hearses and taxis; freight automobiles, automobile chassis, trucks, truck chassis, truck trailers, trucks and trailers combined, buses and bus chassis.
3. Livestock, viz.: bucks, bulls, calves, cattle, cows, dairy cattle, ewes, goats, hogs, horses, kids, lambs, oxen, pigs, sheep, sheep camp outfits, sows, steers, stags or swine.
4. Commodities requiring protection from heat by the use of ice (either water or solidified carbon dioxide) or by mechanical refrigeration.
