SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By the decision hereinafter identified, R. Cali & Bro. was granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing operations as a highway common carrier of canned goods and dried fruit. There are no commodity exclusions included in the certificate.

Under Decision No. 61177, dated December 13, 1960, in Case No. 5432, temperature control charges were established on

"Commodities requiring protection from heat by the use of ice (either water or solidified carbon dioxide) or by mechanical refrigeration."

By letter dated August 2, 1961, the carrier informed the Commission that it would have no objection and requested that the Commission amend its certificate to exclude the transportation of commodities subject to the application of the temperature control charges. The certificate will be amended accordingly. A public hearing is not necessary.

Good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

(1) The certificate of public convenience and necessity granted to R. Cali & Bro. by Decision No. 52904, dated April 17, 1956, in Application No. 36223, is hereby amended by substituting Original Page 1 in place and stead of Appendix A to said Decision No. 52904.

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(2) Within one hundred twenty days after the effective date hereof, and on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and the public, R. Cali & Bro. shall amend its tariffs on file with the Commission to reflect the authority granted herein.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.

R. Cali & Bro., a corporation, by the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted in the decision noted in the margin, is authorized to transport:

1. Canned Goods and other articles as listed under that heading in Item No. 610 on 12th Revised Page 47 of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2.
2. Dried Fruit as described in Items Nos. 19120, 19125, 19155, 19160 and 19215 of Western Classification No. 75, Cal.P.U.C. No. 8, George H. Dumas, Agent, on the issue date thereof and Supplements Nos. 27, 41, 46 and 47 thereto.

between:

1. San Francisco and San Jose via U. S. Highways Nos. 101 and 101 Bypass, including all intermediate points and the points of Sunnyvale and Cupertino.
2. Sunnyvale and Cupertino, on the one hand, and Oakland and Alameda, on the other hand. The authority set forth in this paragraph 2 does not include the right to render service to, from or between intermediate points.

Applicant shall not transport any commodities requiring protection from heat by the use of ice (either water or solidified carbon dioxide) or by mechanical refrigeration.
