SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By the decision hereinafter identified, Gardner's Delivery Service, Inc., acquired a certificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing operations as a highway common carrier of general commodities. The following commodity exclusion is included in the certificate:

> "Commodities requiring the use of special refrigeration or temperature control in specially designed and constructed refrigerated equipment."

Under Decision No. 61177, dated December 13, 1960, in Case No. 5432, temperature control charges were established on

> "Commodities requiring protection from heat by the use of ice (either water or solidified carbon dioxide) or by mechanical refrigeration."

By letter dated June 19, 1961, the carrier informed the Commission that it would have no objection to the revision of its certificate to make the commodity exclusion consistent with the

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application of the temperature control charges. The certificate will be amended accordingly. A public hearing is not necessary.

Good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

(1) The certificate of public convenience and necessity granted to Thomas C. Schneck by Decision No. 55989, dated December 16, 1957, in Application No. 36468, and acquired by Gardner's Delivery Service, Inc., by Decision No. 59831, dated March 29, 1960, in Application No. 42001, is hereby amended by substituting First Revised Page 2 in place and stead of Original Page 2.

(2) Within one hundred twenty days after the effective date hereof, and on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and the public, Gardner's Delivery Service, Inc., shall amend its tariffs on file with the Commission to reflect the authority granted herein.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.

3. Livestock, viz.: bucks, bulls, calves, cattle, cows, dairy cattle, ewes, goats, hogs, horses, kids, lambs, oxen, pigs, sheep, sheep camp outfits, sows, steers, stags or swine.

⁴. Commodities requiring protection from heat by the use of ice (either water or solidified carbon dioxide) or by mechanical refrigeration.

5. Liquids, compressed gases, commodities in semiplastic form and commodities in suspension in liquids in bulk, in tank trucks, tank trailers, tank semitrailers or a combination of such highway vehicles.

- 6. Commodities when transported in bulk in dump trucks or in hopper-type trucks.
- 7. Commodities when transported in motor vehicles equipped for mechanical mixing in transit.
