SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By the decisions hereinafter identified, Leigh C. Hunt was granted certificates of public convenience and necessity authorizing operations as a highway common carrier of general commodities. The following commodity exclusion is included in one of his certificates:

"Commodities requiring the use of special refrigeration or temperature control in specially designed and constructed refrigerated equipment."

Under Decision No. 61177, dated December 13, 1960, in Case No. 5432, temperature control charges were established on

"Commodities requiring protection from heat by the use of ice (either water or solidified carbon dioxide) or by mechanical refrigeration."

By letter received on June 26, 1961, the carrier informed the Commission that he would have no objection to the revision of his certificates to make the commodity exclusion consistent with the application of the temperature control charges. The certificates will be amended accordingly. A public hearing is not necessary.

Good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

(1) The certificate of public convenience and necessity granted to Leigh C. Hunt, doing business as Imperial Drayage Co., by Decision No. 51043, dated January 25, 1955, in Application No. 35556, is hereby amended by adding the following commodity exclusion:

"Commodities requiring protection from heat by the use of ice (either water or solidified carbon dioxide) or by mechanical refrigeration."

(2) The certificate of public convenience and necessity granted to Leigh C. Hunt by Decision No. 54519, dated February 11, 1957, in Application No. 36211, is hereby amended by substituting First Revised Page 1 in place and stead of Original Page 1.

(3) Within one hundred twenty days after the effective date hereof, and on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and the public, Leigh C. Hunt shall amend his tariffs on file with the Commission to reflect the authority granted herein.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.

Leigh C. Hunt, by the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted in the decision noted in the margin, is authorized to transport general commodities between San Mateo and San Jose and intermediate points via U. S. Highways 101 and 101 Bypass. Applicant shall not establish through routes and joint rates, charges and classifications as to the authority hereinabove set forth and the operative rights granted by Decision No. 51043 in Application No. 35556, excepting, however, that this restriction shall not apply as to San Francisco and San Jose and intermediate points via U. S. Highways 101 and 101 Bypass.

Applicant shall not transport any shipments of:

1. Used household goods and personal effects not packed in accordance with the crated property requirements set forth in paragraph (d) of Item No. 10-C of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 4-A.
2. Automobiles, trucks and buses, viz.: new and used, finished or unfinished passenger automobiles (including jeeps), ambulances, hearses and taxis; freight automobiles, automobile chassis, trucks, truck chassis, truck trailers, trucks and trailers combined, buses and bus chassis.
3. Livestock, viz.: bucks, bulls, calves, cattle, cows, dairy cattle, ewes, goats, hogs, horses, kids, lambs, oxen, pigs, sheep, sheep camp outfits, sows, steers, stags or swine.
4. Commodities requiring protection from heat by the use of ice (either water or solidified carbon dioxide) or by mechanical refrigeration.
