SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By the decision hereinafter identified, Navajo Freight Lines, Inc., acquired a certificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing operations as a highway common carrier of freight. There are no commodity exclusions included in the certificate.

Under Decision No. 61177, dated December 13, 1960, in Case No. 5432, temperature control charges were established on

By letter dated August 23, 1961, the carrier requested that the Commission amend its certificate to exclude the transportation of commodities subject to the application of the temperature control charges. The certificate will be amended accordingly. A public hearing is not necessary.
