A. 41574 - 1s 6308<u>4</u> Decision No. BEFORE THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA In the Matter of the Application of SAN DIEGO FORWARDING COMPANY, a corporation, for a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a highway common carrier of general commodities (with named exceptions): (a) Between the points and places in the Los Angelos Basin Region as Application No. 41574 defined; and (b) Between points and places in the Los Angeles Basin Region as defined, on the one hand, and all presently authorized points in San Diego County, pursuant to the Public Utilities Code, Section 1063, as an extension of existing service. ) SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER By the decision hereinafter identified, San Diego Forwarding Company was granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing operations as a highway common carrier of general commodities. The following commodity exclusion is included in the certificate: "Commodities requiring the use of special refrigeration or temperature control is specially designed and constructed refrigerated equipment.' Under Decision No. 61177, dated December 13, 1960, in Case No. 5432, temperature control charges were established on "Commodities requiring protection from heat by the use of ice (either water or solidified carbon dioxide) or by mechanical refrigeration. By letter dated June 23, 1961, the carrier informed the Commission that it would have no objection to the revision of its certificate to make the commodity exclusion consistent with the -1-
