SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By the decision hereinafter identified, Sierra Railroad Company was granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing operations as a highway common carrier of freight. There are no commodity exclusions included in the certificate.

Under Decision No. 61177, dated December 13, 1960, in Case No. 5+32, temperature control charges were established on

"Commodities requiring protection from heat by the use of ice (either water or solidified carbon dioxide) or by mechanical refrigeration."

By letter dated June 30, 1961, the carrier requested that the Commission amend its certificate to exclude the transportation of commodities subject to the application of the temperature control charges. The certificate will be amended accordingly. A public hearing is not necessary.

Good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:


(1) The certificate of public convenience and necessity granted to Sierra Railroad Company by Decision No. 19306 dated February 8, 1928, in Application No. 13647, as amended, is hereby further amended by adding the following commodity exclusion:


"Commodities requiring protection from heat by the use of ice (either water or solidified carbon dioxide) or by mechanical refrigeration."


(2) Within one hundred twenty days after the effective date hereof, and on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and the public, Sierra Railroad Company shall amend its tariffs on file with the Commission to reflect the authority granted herein.


The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
