SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By the decisions hereinafter identified, Thompson Bros., Inc., was granted certificates of public convenience and necessity authorizing operations as a highway common carrier of general commodities. The following commodity exclusion is included in one of the certificates:

"Commodities requiring the use of special refrigeration or temperature control in specially designed and constructed refrigerated equipment."

Under Decision No. 61177, dated December 13, 1960, in Case No. 5432, temperature control charges were established on

"Commodities requiring protection from heat by the use of ice (either water or solidified carbon dioxide) or by mechanical refrigeration."

By letter dated June 20, 1961, the carrier informed the Commission that it would have no objection to the revision of its certificates to make the commodity exclusion consistent with the application of the temperature control charges. The certificates will be amended accordingly. A public hearing is not necessary.

Good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

(1) The certificate of public convenience and necessity granted to Thompson Bros., Inc., by Decision No. 51030, dated January 25, 1955, in Application No. 35173, is hereby amended by adding the following commodity exclusion:


"Commodities requiring protection from heat by the use of ice (either water or solidified carbon dioxide) or by mechanical refrigeration."


(2) The certificate of public convenience and necessity granted to Thompson Bros., Inc., by Decision No. 52788, dated March 13, 1956, in Application No. 36116, is hereby amended by substituting Original Page 1 in place and stead of Appendix A to Decision No. 52788.


(3) Within one hundred twenty days after the effective date hereof, and on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and the public, Thompson Bros., Inc., shall amend its tariffs on file with the Commission to reflect the authority granted herein.


The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.

Thompson Bros., Inc., a corporation, by the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted in the decision noted in the margin, is authorized to transport general commodities between **San Mateo and San Jose and intermediate points via U. S. Highway 101 and 101 By-pass.**

Applicant may use, for operating convenience only, San Francisco Bay Bridge and State Highway 17 between Oakland and San Jose.

Applicant shall not transport any shipments of:

1. Used household goods and personal effects not packed in accordance with the crated property requirements set forth in paragraph (d) of Item No. 10-C of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 4-A.
2. Automobiles, trucks and buses, viz.: new and used, finished or unfinished passenger automobiles (including jeeps), ambulances, hearses and taxis; freight automobiles, automobile chassis, trucks, truck chassis, truck trailers, trucks and trailers combined, buses, bus chassis.
3. Livestock, viz.: bucks, bulls, calves, cattle, cows, dairy cattle, ewes, goats, hogs, horses, kids, lambs, oxen, pigs, sheep, sheep camp outfits, sows, steers, stags or swine.
4. Commodities requiring protection from heat by the use of ice (either water or solidified carbon dioxide) or by mechanical refrigeration.
5. Liquids, compressed gases, commodities in semi-plastic form and commodities in suspension in liquids in bulk, in tank trucks, tank trailers, tank semitrailers or a combination of such highway vehicles.
6. Commodities when transported in bulk in dump trucks or in hopper type trucks.
7. Commodities when transported in motor vehicles equipped for mechanical mixing in transit.
