SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By the decision noted in paragraph (1) below, Watson Bros. Transportation Co., Inc., acquired certificates of public convenience and necessity authorizing operations as a highway common carrier of general commodities. The following commodity exclusion is included in the certificates:

"Commodities requiring special equipment, including refrigeration."

Under Decision No. 61177, dated December 13, 1960, in Case No. 5432, temperature control charges were established on

"Commodities requiring protection from heat by the use of ice (either water or solidified carbon dioxide) or by mechanical refrigeration."

By letter dated December 27, 1961, the carrier informed the Commission that it would have no objection to the revision of its certificate to make the commodity exclusion consistent with the application of the temperature control charges. The certificates will be amended accordingly. A public hearing is not necessary.

Good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:


(1) The certificates of public convenience and necessity acquired by Watson Bros. Transportation Co., Inc., by Decision No. 52152, dated November 1, 1955, and Decision No. 54658, dated March 12, 1957, in Application No. 36977, as amended, are hereby further amended by adding the following commodity exclusion to the list of commodity exclusions included in the certificates:


"Commodities requiring protection from heat by the use of ice (either water or solidified carbon dioxide) or by mechanical refrigeration."


(2) Within one hundred twenty days after the effective date hereof, and on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and the public, Watson Bros. Transportation Co., Inc., shall amend its tariffs on file with the Commission to reflect the authority granted herein.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
