O R D E R

The verified application of Southern Pacific Company discloses that no freight business has been transacted at applicant's station of Serrano, San Luis Obispo County, during the past year and its continued maintenance as a Class "C" non-agency station at which freight in carload lots or in quantities not exceeding 5,000 pounds will be handled (no piece to be larger than two men can handle) is not necessary.

Notice of the application has been given to various parties thought to be interested and no protests have been received. A public hearing does not appear to be necessary.

It is found that public convenience and necessity no longer require the maintenance of such service at the existing degree. Southern Pacific Company is hereby authorized to reclassify its non-agency station of Serrano, County of San Luis Obispo, from Class "C" to Class "E" non-agency station or a station at which freight will not be handled; to change its station records accordingly; and to change all applicable tariffs on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and the public. Such tariff changes shall quote this decision number as the requisite authority. This order shall not be construed as authorization to increase rates or charges.

Within thirty days after reclassification as authorized herein applicant shall so notify the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year, unless time be extended. The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
