ORDER The verified application of The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway filed on January 11, 1962, discloses that no passenger or freight business has been transacted at applicant's stations of Wilton and Usado, Los Angeles County, for a considerable period of time and that continued maintenance thereof is not necessary. The application also alleges that both stations are within the switching limits of Pasadena. Notice of the application has been given to various parties thought to be interested and no protests have been received. A public hearing does not appear to be necessary. It is found that public convenience and necessity no longer require the maintenance of such service. The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Cimpany is hereby authorized to abandon its non-agency stations of Wilton and Usado, County of Los Angeles; to eliminate said name from its station records; and to cancel all tariffs and time schedules applying at said stations on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and the public. Such tariff changes shall quote this decision number as the requisite authority. This order shall not be construed as authorization to increase rates or charges. - 1 -

DJF A. 44093 Within thirty days after abandonment as authorized herein, applicant shall so notify the Commission in writing.
