## OPINION AND ORDER

By Petition for Modification No. 19, California Moving & Storage Association, Inc., seeks to modify the description of Metropolitan Bakersfield Area, which is set forth in Item No. 367 of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 4-A and applies in connection with certain point-to-point rates for the transportation of used household goods and other property. The proposed change results in an enlargement of the current Metropolitan Bakersfield Area and specifically includes, in addition to the City of Bakersfield, all or portions of the following adjacent unincorporated towns or communities: Gosford, Greenfield, Kern County Airport, Lamont, Oil Center, Oildale, Old River, Panama, Rosedale and Stockdale.

Petitioner alleges that the current tariff description of Metropolitan Bakersfield Area has been in effect for eight years; that during this period the City of Bakersfield and its environs have substantially increased from a population standpoint; that new communities have come into being both within the presently described area and that herein proposed; that the proposed description will give realistic effect to the development of Metropolitan Bakersfield;

and that the proposed description will, in many instances, accord to the enlarged area a reduction in rates. 1

The petition shows that copies thereof were served on all known interested parties. No objection to the granting of the petition has been received.

In the circumstances, it appears, and the Commission finds, that the modification in the minimum rates as proposed is reasonable and that the resulting minimum rates and charges will be just, reasonable and nondiscriminatory minimum rates and charges for the transportation of used household goods and other property. Minimum Rate Tariff No. 4-A will be revised accordingly. This is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary. The petition will be granted.

Good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

(1) Minimum Rate Tariff No. 4-A (Appendix A of Decision No. 44919, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective April 21, 1962, First Revised Page 23-A and First Revised Page 23-G, which revised pages are attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

These reductions will occur in connection with the point-to-point rates for the transportation of used household goods and other property between points in the enlarged portion of Metropolitan Bakersfield Area, on the one hand, and Metropolitan Los Angeles, San Francisco-Oakland, Sacramento and San Diego Areas, on the other hand, including certain intermediate points along the authorized routes.
