ORDER

County of Fresno is hereby authorized to construct South Entrance Road at grade across a track of The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company near Avocado, Fresno County, at the location described in the application to be identified as Crossing No. 2Y-13.8. Applicant shall bear entire construction expense, also maintenance cost outside of lines two feet outside of rails. The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company shall bear maintenance cost between such lines. Width of crossing shall be not less than twenty-four feet and grades of approach not greater than six percent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 1 crossing signs (General Order No. 75-B) reflectorized with reflex-reflective sheet material.

Upon completion of Crossing No. 2Y-13.8, South Entrance Road, a private grade crossing at approximate Milepost No. 13.74 shall be abolished by physical closing by railroad.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
