ORDER VACATING SUSPENSION AND INVESTIGATION ORDER

On September 12, 1961, the Commission issued an order of investigation as above-entitled which, among other things, suspended to and including January 22, 1962, the changes in Schedules Nos. 36-T and 44-T filed under Advice Letter No. 8009 by The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company. Subsequently, on December 12, 1961, the period of suspension was extended to and including July 22, 1962. Prior to public hearing on the matter and in response to a written request filed by respondent, the changes in Schedules Nos. 36-T and 44-T filed under Advice Letter No. 8009 were rejected. Therefore, cause for suspension being removed, the suspension order of September 12, 1961, as modified by the order of December 12, 1961, is vacated and set aside and this proceeding discontinued as of the date hereof.
