

OPINION AND ORDER

Applicant holds radial highway common carrier, highway 1 contract carrier and city carrier permits. By Decision No. 62039, dated May 22, 1961, in Application No. 43350, applicant was authorized to transport brandy, in barrels, for Fromm & Sichel, Inc., between Lac Jac, on the one hand, and Biola, Fowler, Monmouth and Mission Bell, on the other hand, at rates less than the established minimum rates. The current authority is scheduled to expire with June 17, 1962.

By this application, applicant seeks authority to continue the current authorization for a further one-year period and to establish an additional less-than-minimum rate of 29 cents per 100 pounds, minimum weight 40,000 pounds, for the transportation of brandy, in barrels, between Lac Jac and Lodi subject to the condition that an immediate backhaul of the same commodity from Lodi to Lac Jac results from each outbound haul from Lac Jac to Lodi. Authority is also

It is also authorized to operate as a highway common carrier of specified commodities between certain points not involved herein.



sought to increase by one-half cent per 100 pounds each of the rates currently authorized between Lac Jac, on the one hand, and Biola, Fowler and Monmouth, on the other hand; and to increase the present rate between Lac Jac and Mission Bell from 18 to 19 cents per 100 2 pounds.

Applicant alleges that, except for increased labor costs, the general conditions concerning the transportation characteristics involved have remained virtually unchanged since the current authority was granted; that the volume of traffic under the current authority has been greater than anticipated; and that the increased rates will serve to offset increased labor costs, which by an existing agreement will become effective on July 1, 1962, as well as any other incidental increase in expenses during the ensuing oneyear period.

Cost and revenue studies submitted by applicant indicate that the new movement to and from Lodi at the proposed rate will be profitable and that the traffic volume thereunder will be substantial. Applicant states that the proposed service to and from Lodi will be integrated with existing operations performed for the same shipper; that applicant possesses the necessary equipment, personnel and facilities for establishing and maintaining service thereto; and that the addition of Lodi will be of significant benefit to the overall operation and will increase its profitableness.

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No authority for the increase is required from this Commission inasmuch as applicant, insofar as this proceeding is concerned, is a permitted carrier for which only minimum rates have been established. Authority for the use of the sought rates after June 17, 1962, is required, however, inasmuch as these rates are below the minimum rates otherwise applicable. The verified application shows that on or about April 24, 1962, a copy thereof was served on various parties believed to be interested, including the California Trucking Associations, Inc. No objection to its being granted has been received.

In the circumstances, it appears, and the Commission finds, that the proposed rates are reasonable. A public hearing is not necessary. The application will be granted.

Good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Harry McKenzie Trucking Co., a corporation, is hereby authorized under Section 3666 of the Public Utilities Code to transport brandy, in barrels, between Lac Jac, on the one hand, and Biola, Fowler, Monmouth, Mission Bell and Lodi, on the other hand, for Fromm & Sichel, Inc., at rates less than the established minimum rates but not less than the following, subject to a minimum weight of 40,000 pounds per shipment, and, as to Lodi, subject to the special conditions shown:

* Applicable only where an immediate backhaul of the same commodity in shipments of not less than 40,000 pounds from Lodi to Lac Jac results from each outbound haul from Lac Jac to Lodi. 2. The authority herein granted shall, on and after June 17, 1962, supersede the authority granted by Decision No. 62039, and shall expire with June 17, 1963.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
