OPINION AND ORDER

In essence, complainant has sought that the area it represents be supplied Crescent City exchange telephone service from West Coast Telephone Company of California in place of the toll station service rendered by The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company.

Pursuant to this Commission's Decision No. 63006, issued January 9, 1962, in Application No. 43945, Pacific sold its toll station facilities in the Hiouchi area to West Coast. The latter has now included such area in its Crescent City exchange and is rendering the desired service to complainant's members. A field inspection made by the Commission staff on May 16, 1962, revealed that approximately 130 Hiouchi area subscribers had been connected to and were being adequately served by West Coast's Crescent City exchange.

It thus appears that the complaint has been satisfied and should be dismissed; accordingly,

IT IS ORDERED that Case No. 7204 be and it is hereby dismissed.
