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SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Minimum Rate Tariff No. 8 names minimum rates, rules and regulations for the transportation of fresh fruits and vegetables. Item No. 290 of the tariff sets forth the description of the San Francisco Wholesale Market Area.

The Commission's Transportation Division staff made a survey of the San Francisco market area on May 29, 1962, to determine whether, and to what extent, the present boundaries of the market area should be revised. The staff report is received in evidence in this proceeding as Exhibit No. 1. According to the report the involved market area is located in the center of the Golden Gateway Project, an area being redeveloped by the San Francisco Redevelopment Agency. Consequently, the produce merchants in the market area are in the process of relocating to other areas. At the present time new permanent facilities are not ready for occupancy requiring those merchants who occupied buildings which are being demolished to temporarily move to locations outside of, but on the fringe of, the present market area. SECTION NO. 1--RULES AND REGULATIONS OF GENERAL APPLICATION (Concluded)

SINGLE MARKET AREAS

Each of the markets described below constitutes a single market area, and includes both sides of streets and avenues named.

Los Angeles

All points within a radius of one mile of the intersection of 9th Street and Central Avenue.

San Francisco

o The San Francisco Wholesale Market bounded on the north by Pacific Avenue. on the east by The Embarcadero, on the south by Sacramente Street, and on the west by Sansene Street.

Oakland

The Oakland Wholesale Market bounded on the north-west by Franklin Street, on the northeast by 5th Street, on the southeast by Jackson Street, and on the southwest by 2nd Street.

San Jose

The San Jose Wholesale Market bounded on the north-west by Mission Street, on northeast by the Southern Pacific right-of-way (8th Street), on the southeast by Taylor Street, and on the southwest by 7th Street.

Stockton

The Stockton Wholesale Market bounded on the north by East Channel Street, on the east by an imaginary extension of Locust Avenue, on the south by the Southern Pacific right-of-way (an extension of East Weber Avenue), and on the west by North Wilson Way.

Sacramento (16th Street Market)

The Sacramento 16th Street Wholesale Market bounded on the north by North C Street, on the east by North 16th Street, on the south by North B Street and on the west by the Southern Pacific right-of-way (That spur adjacent to and paralleling North 14th Street. An extension of Ahern Avenue).

Sacramento (5th Street Market)

The Sacramento 5th Street Wholesale Market bounded on the north by First Avenue, on the east by 5th Street, on the south by the Southern Pacific spur track (from the lead take off commencing near Front & Broadway Streets), and on the west by 3rd Street.

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Fresno

All points within a radius of one mile of the intersection of Tuolumne Street and G Street.

All points within a radius of one-half mile of the intersection of 6th Street and J Street.
