In the matter of the application of KEENEY TRJCK IINES, INC., Grain Products Division, a California corporation for authority under Section 3666 of $\#$ Highway Carrier's Act and under Section 4015 of City Carrier's

Application No. $44+58$ (Filed May 18, 1962) Act, to continue to charge other than minimum rates on Grain, Grain Products and other articles transported for Generai Milis, Inc. under rights granted under Decision No. 60447 of July $26,2961$. )

## OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. 62232 dated June 30, 1961, in Application No. 33438 , Keeney Truck Iines, Inc., Grain Products Division, was authorized, as a permit carrier, to assess monthly vehicle unit rates and charges which are less than the established minimum rates and charges between specified points in southern California for transportation for General Mills, Inc. The authority is scheduled to expire July 3i, 2962.

By this application, authority is sought to continue to charge less than the established minimum rates and to increase the currentiy authorized rates. ${ }^{1}$

Data submitted with the appifeation indicate that appifcant's operation has been conducted at a profit. The application states that the rates proposed, which appilcant has been assessing since September 1, 196I, were established to reflect increases in labor costs.

[^0]In the circumstances, it appears, and the Compassion finds, that the proposed rates are reasonable and consistent with the patio interest. A public hearing is not necessary. The application will be granted.

Because the conditions under which the service is performed may change at any time, the authority will be limited to expire with July 31, 2963, unless sooner canceled, changed or extended by order of the Commission.

Good cause appearing,
II IS ORDERED that:

1. Keeney Truck Lines, Inc., Grain Products Division, operating as a highway contract carrier and as a city carrier, is hereby authorized to transport all commodities for General Mills, Inc., at rates and charges which differ from those established as minimum but not less than those specified between the points shown in and subject to the mines and regulations set forth in Appendix A attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.
2. The authority herein granted shall on and after July 31 , 2962, supersede the authority granted by Decision No. 62232, and shall expire with July 31, 2963, unless sooner canceled, changed or extended by order of the Commission.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days from the date hereof.
