SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

By its Order in Decision No. 63840, dated June 25, 1962, the Commission authorized Southern Pacific Company, applicant, to construct a passing track, an additional track, at Crossing No. B-198.5, intersection of Shaw Avenue with the applicant's main line near Biola Junction, Fresno County. The Order requires that two Standard No. 8 flashing light signals with automatic gate arms be installed as protection.

By its letter dated July 6, 1962, the applicant indicates that the County of Fresno has now commenced negotiations for an early widening project at Crossing No. B-198.5 (Shaw Avenue). Consequently, applicant has requested further authority to permit the immediate construction of its passing track at said crossing with continued protection to be afforded for a short period of time by the two existing Standard No. 8 flashing light signals in order to allow opportunity for resolving the pending alteration project, including time for its construction.

Good cause appearing, IT IS ORDERED that the following sentence in the first paragraph of the Order in Decision No. 63840:

"Protection shall be by two Standard No. 8 crossing signals (General Order No. 75-B) equipped with automatic gate arms."

shall be modified to read as follows:

"Protection shall be by two Standard No. 8 crossing signals (General Order No. 75-B) equipped with automatic gate arms except that for a period of time not to extend beyond November 30, 1962, applicant may temporarily continue to protect Crossing No. B-198.5 with two Standard No. 8 flashing light signals (General Order No. 75-B), each to be equipped with a reflectorized '2 Tracks' sign."

In all other respects Decision No. 63840 is reaffirmed and is in full force and effect.
