The City of Santa Ana is hereby authorized to construct Second Street at grade across two spur tracks of Southern Pacific Company's Santa Ana Branch at the location described in the application, to be identified as Crossing No. BK-517.11-C, in the City of Santa Ana, Orange County.


Construction and maintenance costs shall be borne in accordance with an agreement to be entered into between the parties, and a copy of said executed agreement, together with plans approved by the railroad shall be filed with the Commission prior to commencement of construction. Should the parties fail to agree, the Commission will apportion the costs of construction and maintenance by further order.

Width of crossing shall be not less than 24 feet and grades of approach not greater than one percent in accordance with plan attached to application. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection

shall be by two Standard No. 1 crossing signs (General Order No. 75-B), with reflex reflecting sheet material.

Within thirty days after completion, pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within two years unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
