ORDER OF DISMISSAL

By the complaint herein filed on April 6, 1962, Leo
Butcher requests an order from the Commission requiring the defendant telephone company to install poles along the rear property line
and east tract boundary line of lots 5, 6, and 7, and to furnish
him with service through an underground conduit from said poles.
On May 3, 1952, the telephone company filed an answer containing
general denials, plus an affirmative defense that complainant has
refused to provide easements acceptable to the defendant.

A public hearing on the complaint was held on July 30, 1962. The evidence developed at that hearing showed that the complainant was the owner of the house involved at the time the complaint was filed; that he has sold said property and no longer has

an interest therein. Inasmuch as this is an individual complaint and the evidence shows that the complainant no longer has an interest in the property involved,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the complaint be, and the same bereby is, dismissed.
