O P I N I O N

A Commission staff member having determined, after examina-
 tion as provided in Section 5135 of the Public Utilities Code, that
 Paul J. Atherton, applicant's "responsible managing employee", had
 failed to qualify for a household goods carrier permit, the matter
 was set for hearing at Los Angeles on August 2, 1962, before Examiner
 Mark V. Chiesa.

At the hearing said staff member testified that, on June 25,
 1962, Elena E. Hoover, who had in the meantime replaced Paul J.
 Atherton as applicant's managing employee, was given an examination
 as provided in said code section and that she passed the examina-
 tion and, therefore, applicant has now qualified for a permit.

A financial statement filed with the application shows that
 on March 19, 1962, applicant had Assets of \$74,642.33 and Liabili-
 ties of \$19,682.86.

The application was not opposed, and applicant, being un-
 avoidably absent, chose to rest the matter on the contents of its
 application and the examination of the managing employee.

The Commission finds that applicant possesses the requisite qualifications and the financial resources and responsibility to perform transportation service as a household goods carrier as set forth in the following order.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that on the effective date of this decision the Secretary of the Commission shall cause Household Goods Carrier Permit No. 36-3811 to be issued to Victor Valley Van & Storage Co., Inc., a corporation. Said permit is issued upon the following conditions:

If Elena E. Hoover ceases to be connected with Victor Valley Van & Storage Co., Inc., the latter shall notify the Commission in writing within thirty days after such cessation. If such notice is given, the permit shall remain in force a reasonable length of time in order that another representative of applicant may be qualified before the Public Utilities Commission. If Victor Valley Van & Storage Co., Inc., fails to notify the Commission of such cessation within a thirty-day period, at the end of that period the permit shall be automatically suspended.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
