O P I N I O N

A Commission staff member having determined, after examination and appraisal as provided in Section 5135 of the Public Utilities Code, that applicant is not qualified for a household goods carrier permit, the matter was set for hearing at Los Angeles on August 2, 1962, before Examiner Mark V. Chiesa.

The evidence shows that applicant, having first failed in his examination, thereafter designated George C. Taylor his managing employee to take the required examination. On July 18, 1962, said employee passed such examination. A staff member witness testified that applicant has now qualified for a limited permit in the area within a 30-mile radius of the City of La Mirada. Applicant's financial condition as of April 20, 1962, shows total assets of \$33,500 and total liabilities of \$13,500. The application was not opposed.

The Commission finds that applicant possesses the requisite qualifications and financial resources and responsibility to perform a transportation service as a household goods carrier as set forth in the following order:

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that, on the effective date of this decision, the Secretary of the Commission shall cause Household Goods Carrier Permit No. 19-55338 to be issued to John T. Hall, inserting therein conditions and restrictions limiting applicant's operation to an area within 30 miles of the City of La Mirada, California.

The permit is granted upon the further condition that if George C. Taylor ceases to be connected with John T. Hall, the latter shall notify the Commission in writing within thirty days after such cessation. If such notice is given, the permit shall remain in force a reasonable length of time in order that another representative of applicant may be qualified before the Public Utilities Commission. If John T. Hall fails to notify the Commission of such cessation within a 30-day period, at the end of that period the permit shall be automatically suspended.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
