SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Petitioner, Carnation Company, is engaged in the manufacture and sale of various food products. By this petition, as amended, it seeks the establishment of classification exception ratings in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 for the transportation of certain canned processed potatoes and certain milk and cream substitutes.

The classification ratings currently applicable and the sought exception ratings are as follows:

Petitioner alleges that the processed potatoes and the milk or cream substitutes have transportation characteristics similar to those of other commodities on which the sought reduced ratings now apply.

According to the petition, canned processed potatoes have a value of 29.3 cents per pound and a density of 38.25 pounds per cubic foot. Petitioner points out in comparison that other commodities already included under the canned goods listing in Item No. 320 of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 have a value in excess of 38 cents per pound and a density that is equal to or lower than that of processed potatoes.

The petition states that milk or cream substitutes are new products developed by petitioner and are used almost exclusively for the creaming of coffee. As such, they compete actively with various milk products used for this purpose and for which ratings are now provided in Item No. 345 of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2. Petitioner alleges that the transportation characteristics of its products are identical to those of competing products now embraced by Item No. 345. Petitioner states that, unless it is permitted to ship the new products on the same basis as competitive products within California, it will be unable to achieve statewide competitive distribution thereof.

Copies of the petition and each amendment thereto have been served upon competing shippers, upon the California Trucking Associations, Inc., and upon other interested parties. California Trucking Associations, Inc., has informed the Commission in writing that it has no objection to the ex parte consideration requested. No objection has been received to the granting of this petition.

In the circumstances, it appears, and the Commission finds, that the classification changes sought by petitioner are reasonable; that the revisions in the provisions of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 which are hereinafter prescribed have been shown to be justified and reasonable; and that the resulting rates, rules and regulations are and will be just, reasonable and nondiscriminatory. This appears to be a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary. The petition, as amended, will be granted. Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 will be revised accordingly.

Good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 (Appendix "D" to Decision No. 31606, as amended) is hereby further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective November 10, 1962, the revised pages attached hereto and listed in Appendix A also attached hereto, which pages and appendix by this reference are made a part hereof.

2. Tariff publications authorized to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order, and may be made effective on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than sixty days after the effective date of the minimum rate tariff pages incorporated in this order.

3. Common carriers are hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this

order; and schedules containing the ratings published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.

4. In all other respects, the aforesaid Decision No. 31606, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
