BEFORE THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

In the Matter of the Application of the County of Solano, State of California, to widen the existing crossing at grade of the tracks of the Southern Pacific Company at Crossing No. A-51.4 on County Road No. 73, Suisun Township, Solano County, California, near the City of Fairfield in said county.

O R D E R

County of Solano is hereby authorized to reconstruct and widen the crossing of County Road No. 73 at grade with main line tracks of Southern Pacific Company, (Crossing No. A-51.4) at Tolenas, Solano County, as described in the application and in substantial accordance with the plan attached thereto. Width of crossing shall be not less than 64 feet and grades of approach not greater than two percent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of G. O. No. 72. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 8 flashing light signals (G.O. No. 75-B), equipped with automatic gate arms.

Construction expense shall be apportioned by agreement between the parties or, if they fail to agree, by further order of the Commission. Maintenance cost outside of lines two feet outside of rails shall be borne by applicant. Southern Pacific Company shall bear maintenance cost between such lines.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require. Applicant has indicated a desire to initiate the aforementioned project during the current construction season and asks that the authorization requested be made

effective immediately. Therefore, the effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
