ORDER GRANTING TEMPORARY INTERIM RELIEF

Efrem Arriola, of 1236 S. Atlantic Boulevard, Los Angeles, California, having filed a verified complaint alleging in substance that complainant was a subscriber of telephone service furnished by defendant at that address under number ANGelus 3-9108; that on or about May 14, 1962 such telephone facilities were disconnected by defendant pursuant to instructions from the office of the Sheriff of Los Angeles County; that defendant did not use and does not intend to use telephone facilities to violate or aid or abet violation of the law; that complainant has no knowledge of any illegal activities over said telephone facilities; that complainant has made demand upon defendant and defendant has refused to restore telephone service; that complainant is in the tavern business, it being imperative that he have continuous telephone service; that complainant has suffered and will suffer irreparable injury and great hardship if deprived of telephone facilities; and complainant having requested interim relief,

IT IS ORDERED that The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company, a corporation, is hereby directed to reconnect and restore telephone service to complainant and to maintain such service pending further Commission order herein, said service to be furnished pursuant to defendant's filed tariff rates and rules applicable thereto. The complaint will be set for hearing before such Commissioner or Examiner, and at such time and place, as may hereafter be designated.

The Secretary is directed as follows:

1. To cause a certified copy of this order, together with a copy of the complaint herein, to be served upon The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company, a corporation, and said defendant is directed to serve and file its answer within ten (10) days after said service.
2. To cause a copy of this order to be mailed to complainant.
3. To cause appropriate notice of hearing to be mailed to the parties at least ten (10) days prior to the hearing herein.
