## OPINION

Applicant seeks herein an in lieu certificate of public convenience and necessity so as to consolidate in one certificate the highway common carrier operating authority which it has been granted over a pexiod of 35 years by numerous decisions of this Comission. The application was filed pursuant to an order of this Comission in Decision No. 61727 (Applications Nos. 41429: and 41430).

The Comaission finds that it would be of benefit to applicant, the shrpping public and the Comorssion in the performance of its regulatory functions if all of applicant's highway comon carrier operating rights were consolidated in an in lieu certificate of public convenience and necessity. In order to amalganate the various territorial operating authorities and comodity descriptions in the certificates now held by applicant, it has been necessary to make a few rinor adjustments in these operating rights. However, the purpose of the certificate hereinafter granted is to restate applicant's present operating rights and not to enlarge them. In the circumstances, the Comolssion finds that a public hearing is not necessary and that public convenience and necessity require that the application should be granted as hereinafter set forth.

The Comission takes official notice that in Decision No. 64251 (Application No. 44705) it authorized the transfer of the operating rights here involved to Southem Califorwia Freight Ifnes, Ltd. (which fommerly held all of the outstanding stock of applicant Southern Califormia Freight Lines). The Commission finds chat the certificate of public convenience and necessity hereinafter granted should be issued to Southern California Freight Lines, Itd,

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An application having been filed and the Comission having determined that it should be grapted,

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. A certificate of public convenience and necessity be and it is granted to Southern California Freight Lines, Ltd., a corporation, authorizing it to operate as a highway comon carrier, as defined in Scction 213 of the Public Utilities Code, between the points and over the routes more particularly set forth in Appendices $A, B, C$ and $D$ attached hereto and made a part hereof.
2. In providing service pursuant to the certificate herein granted, Southern California Freight Lines, Ltd., shall comply with and observe the following service regulations:
(a) Within thirty days after the effective date hereof, Southern California Freight lines, Ltd., cate herein granted. By accepting the certificate of public convenience and pecessity herein granted, Southern Califormia Freight Lines, Ltd., is placed on Dotice that it will be required, among other things, to file ampual reports of its operations and to comply with and observe the safety rules and other regulations of the Commission's General Order No. 99 and insurance requirements of the Comotission's General Order No. 100-B. Failure to file such reports, in such form and at such time as the Comission may dixect, or to comply with and observe che provisions of General Orders Nos. 99 and $100-\mathrm{B}$, may result in a cancellation of the operating authority granted by this decision.
(b) Within one hundred twenty days after the effective date hereof, Sourhern Callfornia Freight lines, Ltd., shall establish the service herein authorized and file in the Comilssion's office in triplicate tariffs satisfactory to the comission.
(c) The tariff filings shall be made effective not earlier than thirty days after the effective date of this order on not less than thirty days' notice to the Comission and the public, and the effective date of the tariff filings shall be concurrent with the establishment of the service herein authorized.
(d) The tariff filings made pursuant to this order shall comply with the regulations goveraing the construction and filing of tariffs set forth in the Comission's General Order No. 80-A.
3. The certificate of public convenience and necessity granted in paragraph 1 of this order supersedes the certificates of public convenience and necessity authorizing Southern California Freight Lines, Itd., to operate as a highway comon carrier granted by the following decisions:
