ORDER DISCONTINUING INVESTIGATION

The Commission ordered this investigation of the telephone systems of Citizens Utilities Company of California for the
purpose of determining the reasonableness of respondent's rates,
rules, operations, and practices, and the adequacy of such service and facilities. Respondent was ordered to appear at a hearing
set for September 27, 1962, before Commissioner Peter E. Mitchell
and Examiner Carol T. Coffey and to show cause, if any it had, why
its telephone rates should not be reduced, including but not limited to the elimination of its toll terminal charges.

The scheduled hearing was removed from the Commission's calendar when on September 6, 1962, respondent requested authority to concur in the message toll telephone tariffs of The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company for intracompany traffic and to reduce or eliminate toll terminal charges. On September 25, 1962, by Resolution No. T-5048, the Commission grapted the authority requested and made the revised tariff schedules effective October 7,

1962. It is estimated customers will save \$78,600 annually as a result of this action by the Commission.

This investigation, having substantially accomplished its purpose, will be discontinued.

IT IS ORDERED that the investigation in Case No. 7256 is discontinued.
