OPINION AND ORDER

Souther Warehouse Company requests authority to discontinue warehouse operations at San Francisco, California.

Applicant has been conducting warehouse operations in San Francisco for many years under a tariff on file with this Commission for the storage and handling of automobiles.

It is alleged that applicant, by virtue of a prescriptive right, operates a warehouse at 2100 Jerrold Avenue, San Francisco; that for the past several years it has performed no operations as a public utility warehouseman under its tariff, but has confined itself to performing special services for contract accounts; and that at present it has no public utility warehouse customers.

After consideration the Commission finds that revocation of the operative authority as sought would not be adverse to the public interest. Public hearing is not necessary.

ORDER

Application having been filed and the Commission being informed in the premises,

IT IS ORDERED that the prescriptive rights of Souther Warehouse Company, a corporation, to operate as a public utility warehouseman in the City and County of San Francisco are hereby revoked and its tariff on file with this Commission is hereby canceled.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
