ORDER

Ygnacio Valley Road at grade across a track of Southern Pacific Company in the City of Walnut Creek, Contra Costa County, at the location described in the application identified as Crossing No. BO-47.4. Construction and maintenance expense shall be borne in accordance with an agreement to be entered into between the parties relative thereto. Should the parties fail to agree, the Commission will apportion the cost of construction and maintenance by further order. Width of crossing shall be not less than 109 feet and grades of approach not greater than one percent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by four Standard No. 8 crossing signals (General Order No. 75-3), equipped with reflectorized "STOP ON RED SIGNAL" signs.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless

time be extended or if if above condition

time be extended or if if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.

Applicant desires to begin construction as soon as possible and has requested immediate authorization. Therefore, the effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
