BEFORE THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

In the Matter of the Application of DEALERS TRANSIT, INC., a corporation, for authority to revoke its certificate of public convenience and necessity and to terminate its highway common carrier operations.

Application No. 45107

OPINION AND ORDER

Dealers Transit, Inc., presently authorized to transport motor vehicles and related commodities throughout California as a highway common carrier, requests that its certificated authority be revoked.

It is alleged that discontinuance of its operations as a highway common carrier is necessary because of the financial problems experienced in its service and the increasing business pressures and demands upon its owners; that at present applicant is transporting only trailers for a limited number of shippers, which may be handled under permitted authority; and that the proposed transaction will not be adverse to the public interest, as the need for applicant's service no longer exists and there are sufficient motor carriers transporting vehicles who are available to the shipping public.

After consideration the Commission finds that public convenience and necessity no longer require applicant's service as a highway common carrier. A public hearing is not necessary.

IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. The certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a highway common carrier granted by Decision No. 45990

dated July 24, 1951, in Application No. 29828, as acquired by Dealers Transit, Inc., by Decision No. 63748 dated May 28, 1962, in Application No. 44402, is hereby revoked.

2. Local Distance Commodity Tariff No. 1, Cal. P.U.C. No. 2 (Series of U.S. Delivery, Inc.), issued by Dealers Transit, Inc., is hereby canceled.

3. T. A. L. Loretz, Agent, is authorized and directed to cancel the participation of Dealers Transit, Inc., from his tariffs on file with this Commission, such cancellation to be made within ninety days after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and the public.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
