O R D E R

The verified application of The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company and Fresno Interurban Railway Company filed on January 18, 1963, discloses that no passenger or freight business has been transacted at applicants' non-agency station at Forthcamp, Fresno County, California, for the past several years and that Track No. 2 has not been used for operating purposes during this time.

Notice of the application has been given to various parties thought to be interested and no protests have been received. A public hearing does not appear to be necessary.

It is found that public convenience and necessity no longer require the maintenance of such service. The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company and Fresno Interurban Railway Company are hereby authorized to abandon the non-agency station at Forthcamp, County of Fresno; to remove Track No. 2; to eliminate said name from their station records; and to cancel all tariffs and time schedules applying at said station on not less than 10 days notice to the Commission and public. Such tariff changes shall quote this decision

number as the requisite authority. This order shall not be construed as authorization to increase rates or charges.

Within thirty days after abandonment and removal of the facilities as authorized herein, applicants shall so notify the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year, unless time be extended. The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
