O R D E R

Southern Pacific Company is hereby authorized to construct additional side and spur tracks at grade across Ninth, Tenth and Eleventh Streets in Madera, Madera County, at the locations and substantially as shown in the application, the Ninth Street spur crossing to be identified as a portion of Crossing No. B-184.1. Construction of said crossing shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72, without superelevation and of a width to conform to the portion of the street now graded, with tops of rails flush with the roadway and with grades of approach not exceeding four percent. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 1 crossing signs (General Order No. 75-B) reflectorized with reflex-reflective sheet material. Applicant shall bear entire construction and maintenance expense.

It is alleged that Tenth and Eleventh Streets are not at present open to public use and travel. This order is not to be deemed authority for such openings.

Upon completion of the work authorized herein, the Southern Pacific Company shall eliminate grade crossing B-184.5-C by removal of the tracks from the street.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
