Decision No. 65287

BEFORE THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

In the Matter of the Application of MIRA LOMA WATER CO. for authority to increase rates charged by it for water service.

Application No. 44929 (Filed November 8, 1962)

<u>o p i n i o n</u>

Applicant requests authority to increase its rates for water service to approximately 82 customers in Mira Loma Village, Riverside County. The proposed rates would represent a 100% increase in all charges, and a typical customer with a 3/4 inch service connection now paying \$3.65 a month for flat rate service would pay \$7.30 a month.

Applicant alleges that its present charges for water service are insufficient to meet expenses and shows, in Exhibit G attached to the application, for the year ending September 30, 1962, a loss in net income of about \$3,389.

A report of a staff engineer's field investigation and analysis of applicant's operations is summarized in a memorandum dated February 27, 1963, and is hereby received as Exhibit 1 in this proceeding.

A comparison of the staff's and applicant's estimated operating results for 1963 at present and proposed flat rates may be summarized as follows:

Both the staff's and applicant's estimates reflect no anticipated customer growth during the estimated year 1963. The principal differences between the two estimates arise from the treatment of rate base. The staff excluded from rate base \$14,900 for mains, services, and hydrants installed in Tract No. 2 as no customers are served in that tract and it is anticipated that no customers will be served in that area in the near future. This adjustment also is carried forward into ad valorem taxes and depreciation expense.

Certain other differences may be noted in expenses, wherein, for example, the staff provided for both State and Federal income tax payments, whereas applicant did not include any amount

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for these taxes but deducted interest payments on notes as an expense in determining net revenue.

No customers are served under applicant's present rates for general metered service. The staff estimates that if all customers were served under the proposed rates for metered service, it would be necessary for applicant to install about \$4,000 in meters and accessory utility plant, and a rate of return of 9.3% would be realized. The staff recommends that any revised rates for metered service should be made compatible with rates for flat rate service.

In the course of the staff's investigation, plant and facilities were inspected, customers were interviewed, and company records were analyzed. The engineer reported that pressure readings indicated a system pressure range from 25 to 50 pounds per square inch and the water was clear when observed. Customers have complained, however, of low pressure and the staff recommends that applicant be required to take proper action to insure that pressure is increased as necessary to furnish water service within the limits of pressure prescribed by General Order No. 103.

Based upon a review of the record the Commission finds as follows:

1. The revenues obtainable from the present rates are deficient.

2. The estimates of operating revenues, expenses, including taxes and depreciation, and rate base developed by the staff for the year 1963 are reasonable and should be adopted for the purposes of this proceeding.

3. Applicant is entitled to rate relief at the level

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requested for flat rate service but for metered service the rates should be substantially lower than those requested; meter rates should be designed to produce the same rate of return as the flat rate schedule.

4. The increases in rates and charges authorized herein are justified, the rates and charges authorized herein are reasonable, and the present rates and charges, insofar as they differ from those herein prescribed, are for the future unjust and unreasonable.

5. The staff recommendations concerning depreciation methods, the filing of maps and revised rules, and action to be taken to improve water pressure are reasonable.

6. A public hearing is not necessary.

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IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Applicant, Mira Loma Water Company, a corporation, is authorized to file with this Commission, after the effective date of this order and in conformity with General Order No. 96-A, the schedules of rates attached to this order as Appendix A and, upon not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public, to make such rates effective for service rendered on and after June 1, 1963.

2. Within forty-five days after the effective date of this order, applicant shall file with the Commission, in conformity with General Order No. 96-A, and in a manner acceptable to the Commission, revised rules governing service to customers and a revised tariff service area map. Such rules and tariff service

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
area map shall become effective upon five days' notice to the Commission and to the public after filing as hereinabove provided.

3. Within sixty days after the effective date of this order, applicant shall file with the Commission four copies of a comprehensive map drawn to an indicated scale of not more than 400 feet to the inch, delineating by appropriate markings the various tracts of land and territory served; the principal water production, storage, and distribution facilities; and the location of the various water system properties of applicant.

4. Beginning with the year 1963, applicant shall determine depreciation expense by multiplying depreciable utility plant by a rate of 3.0%. Applicant shall review its depreciation rate, using the straight-line remaining life method, whenever substantial changes in utility plant composition occur and at intervals of not more than five years, and shall revise the above rate in conformance with such reviews. Results of these reviews shall be submitted to the Commission.

5. On or before July 1, 1963, applicant shall increase the pressure settings of the controls of the booster pumps to provide

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minimum service pressure in excess of 25 pounds per square inch during periods of peak usage.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.


