INTERIM OPINION AND ORDER

The Commission by Decision No. 64645, issued December 12, 1962, in the above-entitled matter, authorizes applicant, Glendale City Lines, Inc., to discontinue passenger stage service in Glendale and vicinity. The order specifies that applicant "shall not dispose of any of its assets pending further order of this Commission, to be issued after hearing on the question of severance damages has been held".

Subsequently, by Decision No. 65211, issued herein, on April 10, 1963, applicant was authorized to sell 13 gasoline-powered buses, subject to the condition that the amount received from such sale be deposited in a separate bank account to be held in trust pending further order of this Commission.

Glendale City Lines, on April 22, 1963, filed a petition for authority to sell 15 diesel-powered buses to American International Bus Exchange, Division of Carson Enterprises, Inc., for \$7500, without tires.

The Commission records show that the buses in question were purchased many years ago and that on the average they are approximately 20 years old.

Applicant alleges that unless the buses can be sold promptly the purchaser will withdraw its offer. Glendale City Lines, Inc., agrees to retain the proceeds of such sale pending further order of this Commission.

After consideration of this matter, the Commission finds that the proposed sale would not be adverse to the public interest and that a public hearing is unnecessary.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Glendale City Lines, Inc., may sell to American International Bus Exchange, Division of Carson Enterprises, Inc., the 15 diesel-powered buses listed below:

2. The amount received from said sale shall be deposited in a separate bank account to be held in trust pending further order of the Commission relative thereto.
