SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. 65395, entered today in Case No. 5438 (Petition for Modification No. 33), et al., the Commission transferred to Minimum Rate Tariff No. 8 all minimum rates, charges, rules and regulations applicable to the transportation of produce and certain empty produce containers which were formerly set forth in the Commission's various drayage area tariffs. The aforesaid decision also found that, in order to avoid duplication of tariff distribution, City Carriers' Tariff No. 2-A--Highway Carriers' Tariff No. 1-A should be amended accordingly by separate order.

Good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. City Carriers' Tariff No. 2-A--Highway Carriers' Tariff No. 1-A (Appendix "A" of Decision No. 41362, as amended) is hereby further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective July 6, 1963, the original and revised pages attached hereto and listed in Appendix A also attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

2. Tariff publications resulting in increases required or authorized to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order, on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public; that such tariff publications as are required shall be made effective not later than July 6, 1963; that as to increases which are authorized but not required, the authority herein granted shall expire unless exercised within sixty days after the effective date of this order; and that tariff publications resulting in reductions may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order, and may be made effective on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than sixty days after the effective date of the minimum rate tariff pages incorporated in this order.

3. In all other respects the aforesaid Decision No. 41362, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
