**O R D E R**

Southern Pacific Company is hereby authorized to construct an additional spur track at grade across Market Street near the City of San Pablo, Contra Costa County, at the location described in the application, to be identified as a portion of Crossing No. A-16.6. Construction of said crossing shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72, without super-elevation and of a width to conform to the portion of the street now graded, with tops of rails flush with the roadway and with grades of approach not exceeding two percent. Protection of the additional spur track crossing shall be by one Standard No. 1 crossing sign (General Order No. 75-B) reflectorized with reflex-reflective sheet material. Applicant shall bear entire construction and maintenance expense.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.

Applicant has advised that industry to be served desires early rail service and has requested immediate authorization.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
