OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. 65461, dated May 28, 1963, in this proceeding a certificate of public convenience and necessity was granted to Rosa Water Company (Rosa) to construct a water system in certain parcels, but authority to serve parcel "T", which includes properties of The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company (Pacific), was withheld pending a public hearing thereon, as this parcel was included in the area also requested in Application No. 45238 filed by Southern California Water Company.

Meanwhile, Pacific and Rosa have filed written requests that Rosa be granted authority to extend its existing facilities to furnish water service temporarily to said parcel, pending decision in the aforementioned applications.

Pacific states that the water service is urgently needed for the operation of an air conditioning unit installed to protect certain telephone equipment. Pacific agrees to pay the costs of the necessary highway crossing, with the understanding that temporary service would be established without prejudice to the final determination of the pending applications.

Rosa states that it is in a position to extend temporary water service promptly upon authorization by the Commission.

The Commission has considered these requests and finds that: (1) Pacific has an emergency requirement for water service; (2) the granting of temporary authorization to furnish such service would be without prejudice to the final determination after hearing of Applications Nos. 45166 and 45238; and (3) public convenience and necessity require the furnishing of such temporary service by applicant.

The Commission concludes therefore that such temporary authorization should be granted as provided by the ensuing order.

A public hearing is not necessary.

IT IS ORDERED that:

Rosa Water Company is authorized to extend its water facilities to furnish temporary service to the premises of The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company in parcel "T" as described in the application herein.

The expiration date of this temporary authorization will be established by further order of this Commission.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
