O P I N I O N AND O R D E R

By Decision No. 65273 dated April 23, 1963,
Rossmoor Water Company was granted a certificate of public
convenience and necessity to construct and operate a public
utility water system to serve an area comprising approximately
2,300 acres of unincorporated territory of Orange County to
be known as Rossmoor Leisure World. Ordering paragraph 6 of
said decision provided as follows:

'Upon the filing by applicant of a supplemental
application to which is attached a copy of the
franchise issued by the Board of Supervisors
of the County of Orange, the Commission will
issue a certificate of public convenience and
necessity authorizing it to exercise such
franchise upon such terms and conditions as
the Commission may designate.'

A copy of the franchise ordinance of the County of Orange being Ordinance No. 1604 having been submitted by supplemental application and appearing to be in order, it is found as a fact that public convenience and necessity require that applicant be authorized to exercise the terms of such franchise, therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that Rossmoor Water Company, a corporation, is granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing it to exercise the terms of Orange County franchise Ordinance No. 1604. This does not, however, remove the service area restriction in ordering paragraph 2 of Decision No. 65273, supra.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
