O P I N I O N A N D O R D E R

Suburban Water Systems herein seeks the lifting of the restrictions against extending its water service imposed by Decision No. 58716, dated July 7, 1959^{1/}, and seeks authority to extend its facilities, pursuant to the request of a subdivider, to provide water service to and in Tract No. 25765, consisting of 24 lots adjacent to its Highlands tariff area of its San Jose Hills District in unincorporated territory of Los Angeles County. The location of said tract is shown in "red" on the map, Exhibit "A" attached to the application. The area is contiguous on the north to an area served since 1956, which is shown in "green" on said map. The extension will be made pursuant to applicant's main extension Rule No. 15.

An investigation by a Commission staff engineer and a File Memorandum thereon dated April 15, 1963, hereby made a part of the record as Exhibit 1, disclose that the additional area requested by applicant is relatively small and cannot be served conveniently by any other utility. He recommended that the application be granted. The investigation also discovered

and the memorandum discloses several inaccuracies in applicant's presently filed tariff service area maps. The staff engineer recommended that such inaccuracies be corrected.

Findings

A public hearing is not necessary. Applicant is ready, willing, and able to extend service to Tract No. 25765 and the application should be granted. Applicant's presently filed tariff service area maps are inaccurate, and such inaccuracies should be corrected, based on the information contained in Exhibit 1.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Suburban Water Systems is granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity to extend its water service to and in Tract No. 25765, Los Angeles County, in the area delineated in "red" on the map, Exhibit "A" attached to the application.
2. Applicant shall file a revised tariff service area map of its Highlands tariff area, to provide for the application of its present tariff schedules to Tract No. 25765. Such filing shall be in conformity with General Order No. 96-A and the revised tariff sheet shall become effective upon the fifth day after having been filed.
3. Within ninety days after the effective date of this order, applicant shall file two copies of maps of its entire service area with the following information provided thereon:
 - (a) Its certificated areas.

- (b) Any service areas, outside of its certificated areas, in which service was first provided prior to July 7, 1959.
- (c) Any service areas, outside of its certificated areas, in which service was first provided on or after July 7, 1959.
- (d) Identification and date of installation of each extension outside of its certificated areas.

4. Except for the authorization herein granted, the restrictions against extension of service imposed by the orders in Decisions Nos. 58716, 63116, and 64047 shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
