## ORDER GRANTING INTERIM RELIEF

WILLIAM CATLIN, having filed a verified complaint alleging in substance that he was a subscriber and user of telephone service furnished by defendant at the address 2491 Mission Street, San Francisco, California, under the number of Mission 8-7272; that on or about June 10, 1963, defendant terminated said telephone service; that said telephone service was terminated because one of plaintiff's employees was arrested and accused of violating the Penal Code; that complainant has not been accused of any violation of law; that complainant has not used nor allowed the use of said telephone facilities other than in a lawful manner; that said telephone facilities are absolutely necessary for the operation of complainant's business; that complainant will suffer irreparable damage to his business and reputation unless said telephone facilities are restored; that complainant seeks restoration of said telephone facilities forthwith; and good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company, a corporation, is hereby directed to reconnect and restore telephone service to complainant and to maintain such service pending further Commission order herein, said service to be furnished pursuant to defendant's filed tariff rates and rules applicable thereto. The complaint will be set for hearing before such Commissioner or Examiner, and at such time and place, as may hereafter be designated.
